## **Construction closures for the US 281 / Loop 1604 Interchange project**

---

**(San Antonio)** – Weather permitting, the following closures will occur for the US 281/ Loop 1604 Interchange Project.

**August 5, 2011 – Closures at: US 281 SB frontage lane from Loop 1604 south to Donella; Donella/ Thousand Oaks Exit Ramp at US 281; and US 281 NB to US 281 SB turn around will be closed**

The US 281 frontage road left lane will be closed beginning south of Loop 1604 to Donella Road. This closure includes the US 281 exit ramp to Donella/Thousand Oaks and the US 281 northbound to southbound turnaround. Traffic that normally uses the Donella/Thousand Oaks exit will be directed to use the Loop 1604/ Sonterra exit. Traffic that normally uses the turnaround will be directed to use the intersection at US 281 and Loop 1604. The closures will begin Friday, August 5, 2011 at 10:00 p.m. and are scheduled to open Monday, August 8, 2011 at 5:00 a.m. Construction crews will drill for future placement of concrete.

**August 6 - 7, 2011 – Loop 1604 WB Frontage Lane from Gold Canyon to US 281 will be closed**

The Loop 1604 westbound left frontage lane will be closed from Gold Canyon to US 281 on Saturday, August 6, 2011 from 6:00 a.m. till 5:00 p.m. Traffic will be merged to the right lane, while construction crews begin to place barriers.
